

'FREE FROM' & HYPOALLERGENIC COSMETICS CLAIMS

From 1 July 2019, new guidelines apply to 'free from' and hypoallergenic claims on cosmetics in the EU.

All cosmetics are required to comply with Annex I of EC Regulation 655/2013. Annex III and IV of EC Regulation 655/2013 now provide additional guidance on:

- the prohibition on implying a product has characteristics or functions it does not have (under Article 20 of EC Regulation 1223/2009); and
- the application and interpretation of the 6 common criteria in Annex I that all cosmetics products in the EU must already comply with.



ANNEX III - 'FREE FROM' CLAIMS.

'Free from' claims are generally still permitted, provided they comply with the common criteria and do not mislead. For example, a children's mouthwash can claim 'free from alcohol' as it allows parents to make an informed purchasing decision about the product (1 of the criterion in the common criteria).

ANNEX IV -HYPOALLERGENIC CLAIMS•

Hypoallergenic claims may only be made if the product has been formulated to reduce its allergenic potential. Even if this is met, take care to ensure the claim does not give the impression that the product has no risk of allergic reaction at all.
